If you presented at that meeting, you should have already heard from them. The deadline for submissions is November 30. We are targeting the March issue for publication of the proceedings.

During the wonderful meeting in Belem, I had the opportunity to talk to many of you and to collect ideas for further developing of the Bulletin. I am happy to announce our next steps:

- By the end of 2014, HEB will have fulfilled the precondition for being listed, i.e. two years of regular publication history. ISI listings will be pursued from the beginning of 2015. I will keep you posted on the progress.
- ISHE will sponsor the migration of HEB from the current system to a professional online platform. We are currently dealing with the technical issues and setup. We hope to launch the new system no later than by the beginning of 2015.

- HEB has a <u>Facebook page</u>. This is our main means of communication with you in between issues "like" it and share your ideas with us!
