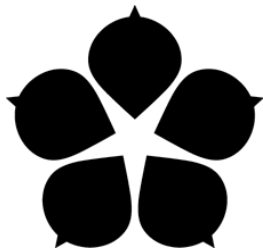

WELCOME!

European part of the Summer Institute will take place in České Budějovice, Czech Republic. The city of České Budějovice is the capital of the South Bohemian Region. It is a royal town founded in 1265, famous around the world especially for its Budweiser Budvar brewery.



Thanks to over 750 years of tradition, it contains numerous impressive sites, located mainly in and around its historical center, which is the urban heritage reserve. The main square bears the name of King Přemysl Otakar II, founder of the town. It is the largest square in the Czech Republic and one of the largest in Europe. In its center stands the baroque Samson's fountain - one of the symbols of the city. On or nearby the square can be found some of the most notable

sites, including the majestic Town Hall building, the Gothic-Renaissance Black Tower – the dominant feature of České Budějovice, the Dominican monastery with the Church of Presentation of Virgin Mary, the remains of the Gothic fortifications of the town, including the four-story Iron Maiden tower, The former meat market (“Masné krámy”), or the former salt house (“Solnice”), both converted into renowned restaurants.

For beer enthusiasts, a visit to the Budweiser Budvar Brewery is an absolute must. The world-famous Budweiser Budvar beer has been brewed here since 1895. A guided tour allows visitors to witness the traditional brewing process firsthand.

Lovers of nature and outdoor activities will also find plenty to do here. České Budějovice is located at the confluence of rivers Vltava and Malše – both great for canoeing and rafting - and is surrounded by beautiful landscape of meadows and carp lakes, forests, and the hills of the Blanský Forest and Šumava Mountains. Nearby you can find architectural jewels such as Hluboká nad Vltavou chateau, Zlatá Koruna monastery, and two UNESCO world heritage sites: The town of Český Krumlov and the the village of Holašovice.

Last but not least, České Budějovice is a university town with almost 10,000 students.

We are certain that besides the informative lectures and the lively exchange with fellow scientists, a city like České Budějovice will make the ISHE Summer Institute 2023 an unforgettable experience.

Social Programme:

Guided tour at the ZOO Hluboká nad Vltavou, Sun, July 23, 16.30-19.00, parallels with the Brewery tour. Bus transport will be provided from the main venue.

Zoo Hluboká nad Vltavou is located in the town of Hluboká nad Vltavou. The zoo specializes in animals from the Palearctic zoogeographical region. The tour will be conducted by Dr. Jan Robovský from the Faculty of Science, University of South Bohemia, who specializes in large mammals and their breeding in zoos. We will go from České Budějovice and back by bus.

Guided tour at the Budweiser Budvar brewery, Karolíny Světlé 512/4, Sun, July 23, 16.30-19.00, parallels with the ZOO tour. You will go there by public transport accompanied by a local organizer.

An excursion to the Budweiser Budvar brewery promises an immersive and unforgettable experience for beer enthusiasts and curious visitors alike. The tour will be concluded by a tasting session. Please note that the temperature within the brewery is very low at some parts so warm clothes are highly recommended. To get to the Budweiser Budvar's Visitor Centre, take bus n° 3. Get on at bus stop “Jihočeská univerzita” and get off at stop “Poliklinika Sever” after some 10-15 minutes. There, get on bus n° 2 going in the opposite direction and get off after 5-10 minutes at stop called “Budvar”.



Evening at Studentský klub Kampa (Student club Kampa), Studentská 1824/29, Sun, July 23, 19.30-23.00. Student club Kampa is located on “Studentská” street within the campus, near student dormitory K4.

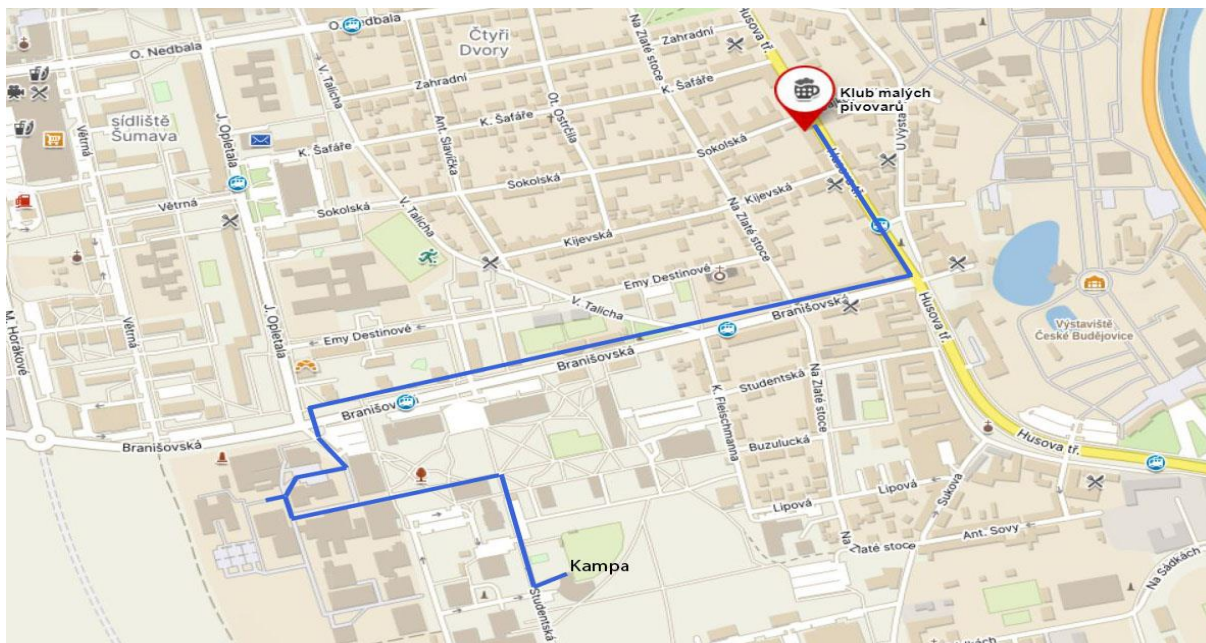
Český Krumlov city tour, Mon. July 24, 13.30-19.00. Includes lunch.



Český Krumlov, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is a picturesque medieval town about 30 min ride from České Budějovice. The town is dominated by a stunning Český Krumlov Castle, one of the largest castle complexes in the world, which provides panoramic views of the town and the surrounding landscape. Visitors can explore the narrow cobblestone streets lined with charming shops, cafes, and restaurants. We will go from České Budějovice by bus and have lunch in the town. The guided tour starts at 15:00 and takes approximately 2hr.

Evening at Klub malých pivovarů - KMP (Small Breweries Club), Husova tř.119/103, Mon, July 24, 19.30-23.00. Meat & veggie grill available, should be ordered in advance. For orders contact registration desk.

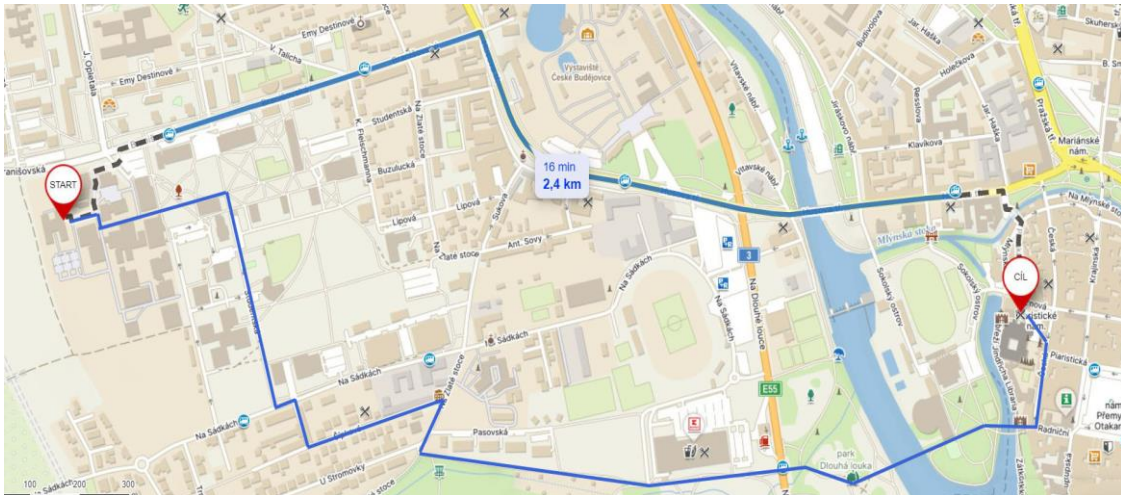
The Small Breweries Club (“Klub malých pivovarů or KMP”) is also best reached by foot as it is only about 1 km from the conference venue. It takes about 10 minutes to get there. Walk along “Branišovská” street for about 750 m until you reach the intersection with “Husova” street. Turn left and continue for another 250 m, until you reach the house with the “KMP” sign.



Conference dinner at Solnice (Salt House) restaurant, Piaristické nám. 490/3, Tue, July 25, 19.00-24.00. The Best poster award will be announced. Live music by Dělníci vědy (Workers of Science).



The Solnice Restaurant where the conference dinner will be held is in the city center, about 2,5 km from the conference venue. The fastest way to get there is to take the bus n° 3. Get on at bus stop “Jihočeská univerzita” and get off at stop called “U Zelené ratolesti” after some 5 minutes. From there, continue for about 100 m along “Husova” street, turn right and walk along “Panská” street for 200 m. You will arrive at the square called Piaristické náměstí. Restaurace Solnice is a white landmark building to your right. Alternatively, you can walk there using the same route – along “Branišovská” street and “Husova” street. You can also take longer but nicer walk through the campus, the city park (called “Stromovka”) and through the city center.



TRANSPORTATION

Getting to České Budějovice

The nearest airports are Prague airport and Linz airport. There is a frequent train and bus connection between Prague and České Budějovice. Alternatively, one can take a train or bus from Linz. It takes about 2 hours to get to České Budějovice from Prague or Linz.

You can get a 60-minute ticket for 20 CZK from the yellow machines at bus stops or you can pay contactless inside the bus; the yellow machine will give you basic ticket (no need to make a selection on a display). Don't forget to validate your ticket inside the bus. Consider buying a 168-hour (one-week) ticket for 200 CZK (about 8 EUR), especially if you won't be staying in the campus all the time.

Taxis are not very expensive in České Budějovice. You may find a taxi of the company Taxi Budejovice s.r.o (Tel.: +420 385 310 689) in front of the train station. Otherwise, you can call for a taxi from these companies:

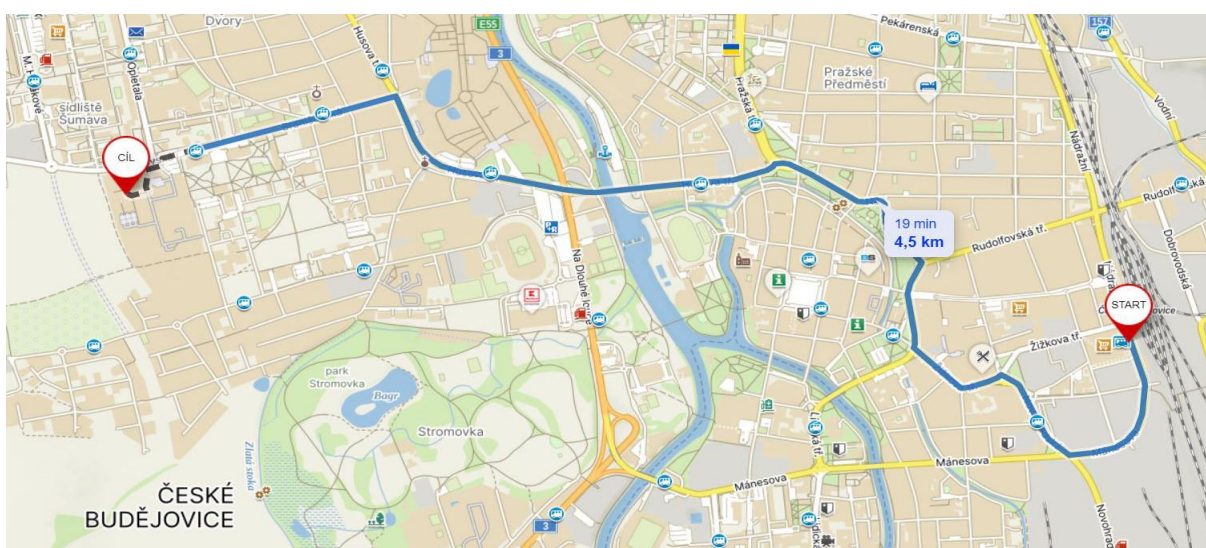
How to get to conference venue:

- **From bus or railway station to the conference venue (university campus)**

The bus station is situated on the top floor of the commercial center called “Mercury”. The name of the bus stop is “Nádraží”, and it is on the side of the building of Mercury. The railway station is located close by.

To get to the university, take bus n° 3 and get off at bus stop “Jihočeská univerzita”. It takes about 15 minutes from the station. During the night, take the bus n° 53.

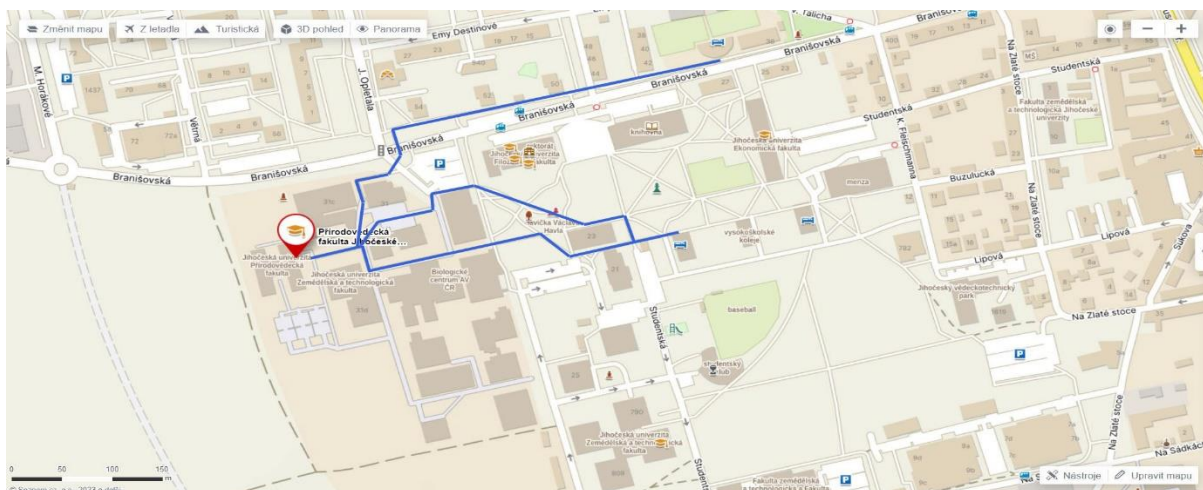
The campus is located on the “Branišovská” street. Student dormitories K1–K4 are tall buildings about 200 m from the bus stop, on the other side of the street. The Dormitory Pedagogue is also on “Branišovská” street (1800/36a), about 200 m to the east. The Faculty of Science of the USB – the conference venue, is located about 200 m to the west from the bus stop, on the other side of the street.



- **From student dormitories to the conference venue**

The student dormitories are located in or near the campus of the Faculty of Science. The conference venue is only about 5 minutes' walk from there. From the dormitories K1, turn left and walk through the campus for about 450-250 m until you reach the area in front of Building C (Branišovská 31c, Branišovská 1760), where the meeting takes place.

From the Dormitory Pedagogue, turn right, walk along “Branišovská” street for about 300 m, cross the street before the intersection and continue to the area in front of Building C.

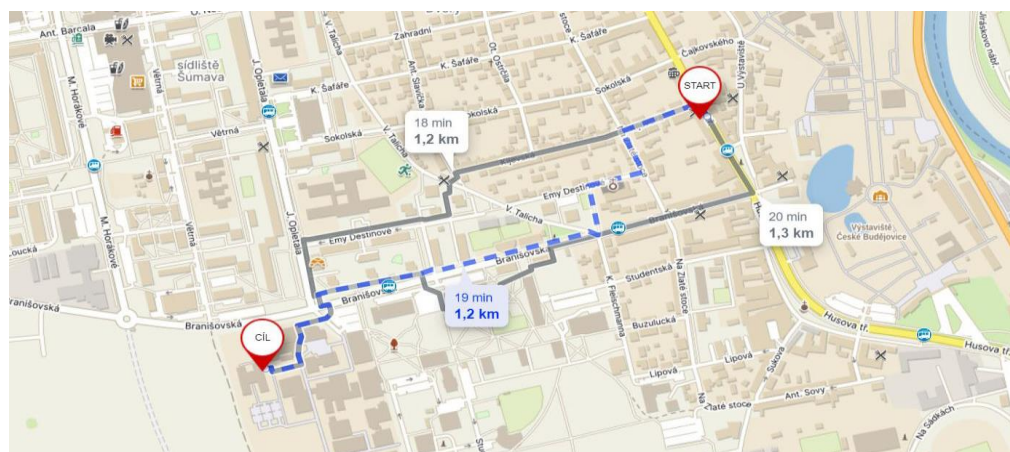


- **From the hotels in the city center to the conference venue**

The conference venue is about 3-4 km from the city center, so it is quicker and more comfortable to take a bus. The most accessible bus stop from most hotels in the center (incl. Cuba Bar & Hostel) is called “Poliklinika Sever”. Take the bus n° 3 and get off at bus stop “Jihočeská univerzita”. It takes about 10-15 minutes to get to there.

- **From Penzion 4 Dvory to the conference venue**

Penzion 4 Dvory is located on “Husova” street, about 10-15 minutes' walk from the conference venue. Turn right and walk along the “Husova” street for about 200 m, until you reach the intersection with “Branišovská” street. Walk about 800 m, cross the street before the intersection and walk into the campus.
